ACADEMIC PROGRAMS & REQUIREMENTS:

- Semester system
- Honors courses offered in the majority of major disciplines in grades 9 12
- Grades 9, 10, 11- minimum of six courses
- Grade 12- minimum of five courses
- Options Program- an inclusive educational experience for students with special needs. Students with mild to moderate intellectual disabilities are accepted into the program and are included in regular classrooms for 80-100% of the day.
- Academic Grouping- Students are placed based on academic performance, standardized test scores, and teacher recommendations. Students may have customized learning plans involving more than one instructional level.
 - A2 College Preparatory: Designed for students who need a more guided approach to their studies. Graded on a 3.5 scale.
 - A1 College Preparatory: Offers some independent study and a fast learning pace. Graded on a 4.5 scale.
 - Honors and AP: Challenges gifted students. AP courses are graded on a 6.5 scale. Honors courses are graded on a 5.5 scale.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT:

Department approval and strong academic standing are required for all students who wish to enroll in an AP class. For the years 2019, 2020, and 2021, eighty-two percent of students received a 3 or better on their AP test and were eligible for college credit.
