- Have an unweighted GPA of at least 2.5
- Taking courses to prepare for academic success during and after college
- Planning to attend a two-year or four-year college upon graduation
- Eligible for a Pell Grant (This online tool, [FASFA4Caster](#), gives you a free early estimate of your eligibility).

#### **Selection Process**

- Selection criteria include, but are not limited to, substantial financial need, academic performance and letters of recommendation. The selection committee will look for character traits and aspirations in applicants that will serve as a fitting legacy to the life of Rev. Clementa C. Pinckney.
- Applications are accepted in the fall semester of students' junior year of high school, and selections are announced in December.
- Up to 30 students are selected each year.

- Be motivated, intellectually curious and to take advantage of opportunities.

## Veterans of Foreign Wars Voice of Democracy Audio and Essay Competition

**Deadline: October 31, 2023**

Established in 1947, our Voice of Democracy audio-essay program provides high school students with the unique opportunity to express themselves in regards to a democratic and patriotic-themed recorded essay. Each year, nearly 40,000 9-12 grade students from across the country enter to win their share of \$2.1 million in educational scholarships and incentives awarded through the program.

The national first-place winner receives a \$30,000 scholarship paid directly to the recipient's American university, college or vocational/technical school. A complete list of other national scholarships range from \$1,000-\$16,000, and the first-place winner from each VFW Department (state) wins a minimum scholarship of \$1,000 and an all-expense-paid trip to Washington, D.C.

### **Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange**

**Deadline: December 1, 2022**

Funded by the U.S. Congress and German Bundestag. Each year, 50 scholarships are awarded to American high school students to live in Germany on a one-year full scholarship. The program aims to foster cultural understanding and diplomacy, while promoting the learning of the German language by direct cultural immersion. Previous knowledge of German language is NOT required. You must be a U.S. citizen, national or permanent resident; have a GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be between the ages of 15 and 18 and 6 months (18.5) by August 1 of the departure year.

Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange scholars are considered youth ambassadors of the U.S. and are expected to learn more about the political systems of their country and Germany. The program is approximately 10.5 months, with departure in August 2023 and return in June 2024.
